## About Us



Since 1923, Greater Long Beach Alumnae Panhellenic (GLBAP) has supported the sorority experience of leadership, friendship, community service and scholarship for university women from the Long Beach area.

The members of GLBAP are sorority alumnae who represent the 26 organizations that comprise National Panhellenic Conference (NPC), one of the oldest and largest organizations advocating for women. Our members have experienced the many benefits that sororities offer individuals – not just in college, but throughout their lives – and work to promote participation in the sorority system among both students and alumnae.

Our primary focus is to provide scholarships and other assistance to collegians at California State University Long Beach (CSULB) as well as to sorority members who live here and attend college outside the area. We also publicize the accomplishments of sororities and their members, foster collaboration among sororities, help with annual recruitment at CSULB, partner with the university in studying and solving problems facing students, and support community service projects.



## Go Greek...for Life

Sorority sisterhood begins in college and can last a lifetime. The bonds made in sororities are rewarding, powerful and enduring.

Sorority membership enables young women to make lifelong friendships, strive for academic excellence, contribute to their communities and share experiences that will help shape a successful future. Sororities provide members with a broad range of social events and offer opportunities for them to build teamwork and effective leadership skills.

Community service is also a fundamental part of the sorority experience, and members plan and participate in chapter-sponsored and community-based service projects as well as contribute money and/or time to national philanthropies. Most importantly, every sorority places great emphasis on high scholarship and promotes academic excellence through incentive programs, honor societies, workshops and tutoring. After graduation, members are encouraged to remain active with their sorority by joining an alumnae group.

Continued sorority affiliation offers women an impressive range of support throughout their lives. These advantages include: a network of alumnae contacts; career leads and mentoring opportunities; a chance to give back through charity events and volunteer work; and a welcoming voice, helping hand and practical advice in a new city. A Gallup poll of college graduates found that members of sororities and fraternities are more likely to be thriving overall and more engaged at work than those who did not go Greek.



## Voice for Sorority Advancement

GLBAP is part of the National Panhellenic Conference (NPC). Founded in 1902, NPC is the umbrella group for 26 sororities and is the premier advocacy and support organization for advancing the sorority experience. Today, NPC sororities are located on more than 665 campuses with over 400,000 undergraduate members and there are 3,450 active Alumnae Panhellenic groups throughout the world.

Each year, NPC-affiliated collegians and alumnae donate more than \$5 million to worthy causes, provide \$2.8 million in scholarships to women and volunteer 500,000 hours in their communities. NPC is committed to relationships built on trust through transparency, accountability and mutual respect. Innovation and the core values of friendship, leadership, service, knowledge, integrity and community guide NPC women.
